“ As a child I can recall my Grandmother talking about her 'Baby Brother Tommy' with endeared affection. Fast forward some 20 plus years later I would meet Uncle Tommy for the first time. I was staying in Oak Park, California and was reluctant to move to LA but a circumstance and inspiration, (as the Lord would have it), led me to move to LA near Uncle Tommy.

We connected right away. Immediately he let me in, into his heart and into his life. Uncle Tommy was warm, gentle, giving and easy to talk with. We would eat together often, sometimes at his home but mostly at one of his favorite restaurant 'spots'. Sometimes Linda would go with us other times it would be him and I and a few times even my friends. He saw to it that I was good, you know safe, doing well and that he laid eyes on me. I forgot to mention that my friends took a quick likening to him and often asked about him. A older lady I knew was asking me too many questions about Uncle Tommy and I had to tell her, "my uncle is married!"

We were talking one day at their home, I don't recall exactly what, but something was said in regard to past years that Linda questioned. I then explained to her that I just met Uncle Tommy when I moved to LA. She was floored in disbelief that we had just then shortly met for the first time. Then there was the time I was waiting at a red traffic light, a horn sounded, I turned to look and Uncle Tommy was left side of me. We were the people you hate to see, at the traffic light, in separate cars talking and momentarily delaying traffic 🚗

After time Uncle Tommy became ill, really ill and was admitted to ICU for a while, sedated and ventilated. Now I kept my eyes on him, frequently visiting and as an ICU nurse myself, I kept watch on the medical team. At this time Glen and family were hours away in San Diego.

Whenever I spoke with different doctors and nurses my speech would betray me and I would be asked, "What do you do, are you in the medical field?"

After seeing me a few times at the bedside one nurse assumed I was his daughter. She told the assigned nurse, "Mr.Ford daughter is here" then it was said, "you look like your Dad."

So then news spread that Mr.Ford daughter is an ICU nurse. I didn't correct this right away, the desired goal of him having good quality care was being met. The Lord blessed and Uncle Tommy got well. He would say, "I thought that was the last time I would see you when I was in that hospital" referring to how ill he was. I was blessed with him, especially during that time in my life. So, like my grandmother, when I talk about Uncle Tommy it is with endeared affection, he is to me "My California Daddy" he made a home for me away from home.
